The defendant is hereby placed on probation for a term of 2 year(s)

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state, or local crime.

The defendant shall not illegally possess a controlled substance.

For offenses committed on or after September 13, 1994:

The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of placement on probation and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as directed by the probation officer.

The above drug testing condition is suspended based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check, if applicable.)

The defendant shall not possess a firearm as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 921. (Check, if applicable.)

If this judgment imposes a fine or a restitution obligation, it shall be a condition of probation that the defendant pay any such fine or restitution in accordance with the Schedule of Payments set forth in the Criminal Monetary Penalties sheet of this judgment.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1) the defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer;
- the defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month;
- 3) the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- 4) the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- 5) the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- 6) the defendant shall notify the probation officer ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- 7) the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol;
- 8) the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 9) the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity, and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court;
- 13) as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

ADDITIONAL PROBATION TERMS

As a condition of probation the defendant is ordered to make restitution totaling \$2,500,000.00 to the identified victims in this case.

Restitution and fine payments are payable to the U.S. COURTS and is to be addressed to: U.S. Clerk's Office, Attention: Financial Section, 301 North Miami Avenue, Room 150, Miami, Florida 33128, who will then forward restitution payments to the recipients/victims in the list filed under seal with the Clerk of Court. Restitution and the fine is payable immediately. The U.S. Probation Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office are responsible for the enforcement of this order.

It is further ordered that \$400,000.00 will be placed by the defendant into an escrow account to be used specifically for aggrieved customers who want a refund of monies previously paid to the defendant. The cost of maintaining this account shall be borne by the defendant, its successors, or assigns. Any disbursements resulting from such requests, will be decided upon and administered by the office of the Florida Attorney General.

While on probation, the defendant shall comply with the following special conditions pursuant to the written plea agreement:

- 1) The defendant shall make periodic submissions to a mutually agreed upon CPA/forensic accountant, on a quarterly basis, reporting on the organization's financial condition and results of business operations, and accounting for disposition of all funds received. Compensation to and costs of the forensic accountant shall be paid by the defendant, and/or Auto Resolution, Inc., and Street Beasts, Inc., their successors, or assigns.
- 2) The defendant shall submit to a reasonable number of regular or unannounced examinations of its books and records at appropriate business premises by the mutually agreed upon forensic accountant and interrogation of knowledgeable individuals within the organization. Compensation to and costs of the CPA/forensic accountant shall be paid by the defendant, and/or Auto Resolution, Inc., and Street Beasts, Inc., their successors, or assigns.
- 3) The defendant shall be required to notify the U.S. Probation Office immediately upon learning of any material adverse change in its business or financial condition or prospects, or the commencement of any bankruptcy proceeding, major civil litigation in excess of \$25,000.00, criminal prosecution or administrative proceeding against the organization, or any investigation or formal inquiry by governmental authorities regarding the organization.
- 4) The defendant shall be required to make periodic payments, as specified by the Court, in the following priority: restitution; fine; and any other monetary sanction.
